Grammar Areas That Need Attention in 3b-c

- 1 Past Tenses (simple, cont, perf.) vs. present perfect (simple, cont.)
Nicole / Melanie
- 2 Conditionals II / III *Kathyia / Lea*
“wish / if only / expressions requiring “subjunctive”, e.g. it is high time we **did** something about it. *Nathalie / Leonie*
- 3 Subclauses with conjunctions of TIME (≈ conditionals I), e.g. “By the time he **reads** this, it will be too late.” *Antoine / Yannick*
- 4 Relative Clauses: defining vs. non-defining / what, who, whose, that (NO comma before “that”!) *Sujeni / Jessica*
- 5 Future “will be doing” / future in the past *Jean-Luc / Dario*
- 6 Articles: definite vs. indefinite *Selina / Fiona*
- 7 Lots of little things: *up to f. / Livia Stefanie*
 - a. Spelling: CAPITAL letter, -y ---> -ies, u vs. ou, quite vs. quiet, dates, sure, etc.
 - b. Word order: after go, after neg./restr. Expressions
 - c. Possessives: my vs. mine, (on) my own, of my own, ‘s
 - d. Will, be willing to, want to, want, would rather, had better
 - e. Linking devices: e.g. “for all that”
 - f. Non-c words: e.g. information
from g. Mark / Lorena
 - g. Used to do vs. used to doing (Gerund vs. Inf.)
 - h. Tag phrases, esp. with unusual expressions: we had better..., hadn’t we
 - i. (a) little, (a) few, much, many, a lot (of), lots (of), plenty (of), so vs. such, hardly (+ !),
 - j. this vs. these, play **THE** piano
 - k. prepositions: on, at, in, for
