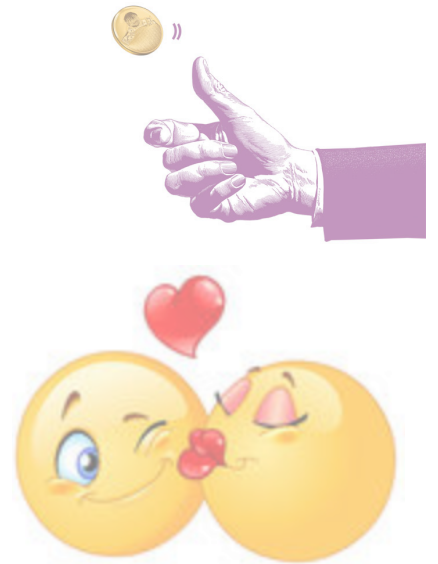

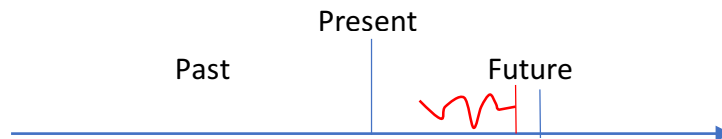

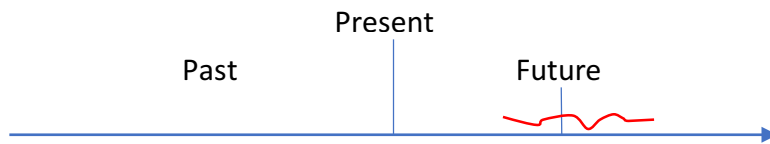

- Don't ring me at 6 o'clock in the morning. **I'll be sleeping** at that time.

an alternative for arranged actions in the future:
