- 9 I'd prefer (leave) now, common, let's (go)
– All right, let me just (finish) my drink, ok?
- 10 When he started to dislike (play) football, he gave up (do) sports altogether (überhaupt).
- 11 What are we doing after (finish) school? – Well, I would not mind (go) for a jog, what about you? – Oh no! I hate (jog) ! – Ok, then I'll be looking forward to (see) you at the pub tonight. Bye.
- 12 Look at all the lovely pictures they are sending from Spain. I really regret (not go) with them. They asked me, you know!
