## Past Simple vs. Past Continuous

## 1-Action Situations:







A) You can see the whole action from some distance (space or time):

PAST SIMPLE: The man threw the ball at his head. / The ball hit the man's face.



B) You can only see a part of the action, but from close by / in detail / slow motion:

PAST CONTINUOUS: The man was throwing the ball at his face. / The ball was hitting the man's face.

## 2-Action Situations:

## A) one action interrupts another that is ongoing:



The man <u>was looking</u> at us (ongoing action) when the ball hit him. (new action that interrupts)

each of the actions below is finished!1



- **B) one action AFTER the other:** One man threw the ball, it hit the other man's face and then fell to the ground.
- C) two simultaneous (at the same time)
- C1: CLOSE-UP actions: She was reading while I was working. (description of a situation, ongoing actions, not finished)
- C2: WHOLE action from a distance: She always read while I cooked. (habit / repeated action in the past)
